

## **GAYATRI DEVI MD, MS, FACP, FAAN** **Director, Park Avenue Neurology**



Dr. Gayatri Devi is a neurologist whose career has focused on brain health and cognitive disorders. She founded Park Avenue Neurology in 1999, a center for neurological wellness, education, and clinical research. She is board-certified in Neurology, Pain Medicine, Psychiatry, Brain Injury Medicine, and Behavioral Neurology.

Her clinical work has emphasized precision medicine in neurology. She has contributed to the understanding of Alzheimer's disease as a spectrum disorder. She developed clinical criteria for menopause-related cognitive impairment, an under-recognized condition affecting millions of women. Dr. Devi was an early researcher and adopter of transcranial magnetic stimulation in cognitive disorders. She has published on reducing the risk of brain hemorrhage and brain edema with anti-amyloid therapy. Her approach to Alzheimer's and removing diagnostic stigma while maintaining functioning was featured in the *New England Journal of Medicine*.

Dr. Devi is an Attending Physician at Lenox Hill Hospital and a Clinical Professor of Neurology and Psychiatry at Zucker SOM. Prior roles include Clinical Associate Professor of Neurology and Psychiatry at NYU, Assistant Professor of Neurology at Columbia University, and Clinical Core Co-Director of the Taub Alzheimer's Disease Research Center at Columbia. Nationally, she was President of the American Medical Women's Association & the National Council on Women's Health.

She has appeared in media outlets such as the BBC, CBS, NPR, TIME, The New York Times, and The Wall Street Journal. [Widely published in medical journals](#), Dr. Devi is the author of *Spectrum of Hope*. She has served as a reviewer for the New England Journal of Medicine and the Lancet Group.

Dr. Devi's honors include the Presidential Award from the American Medical Women's Association, Innovator in Health Care Award from CaringKind. She was a Distinguished Visiting Professor at Weill Cornell Medical College. She is a Fellow of the American Academy of Neurology and the American College of Physicians. She serves as Consultant to the NYS Committee on Physician Health. She serves on the boards of CaringKind, New York's premier caregiving organization, & Columbia's SPS.

She founded and directed the "Girls Get Healthy" program at Weill Cornell, providing for-credit health education to more than 1,100 inner-city schoolgirls each year for over a decade. A proud New Yorker, Dr. Devi serves as a trustee of Central Park, and is a loyal fan of both the NY Yankees, and her daughter, a surgeon.
